

SERVANT LEADERSHIP PROGRAM COMMONLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What might I do as part of the Servant Leadership Program team?

Servant Leadership Program team members can expect to experience many things by the end of the five-week program. Each day will be different; some days will be spent in hands-on tasks in the dishroom, grounds, and housekeeping crews, while other days will be spent helping counsel at Boys Camp or Girls Camp, or taking time to better understand Christ-like leadership through Bible-study and small group activities.

What kind of supervision will there be?

The SLP team will be supervised by two full-time On-Site Directors and will have interaction with the Program Director as well. The On-Site Directors are young adults with experience working with youth and familiarity with Twin Rocks. When working, the SLP team will also be supervised by year-round camp staff and will work alongside college-age Summer Staff members.

What activities does Twin Rocks Friends Camp offer?

Twin Rocks staff members can enjoy a wide range of outdoor activities including sand volleyball, boating, swimming, hiking, and Frisbee golf. Indoors, staff can play basketball, foosball, pool or ping-pong in the camp's newly renovated "Shelter" gymnasium or just hang out together at the camp. Twin Rocks' location, just one block from the beach, also offers team members the benefits of beach bonfires, ocean sunsets and exploring miles of pristine beach. Most freetime will be filled with planned events designed for fun and relaxation.

What type of accommodations will the Servant Leadership Program team live in?

This summer, SLP members will be staying at Kilchis and Quechua cabins which provide great accessibility to all the camp has to offer. The final week of the program, team members will travel to Newberg, Oregon to attend Yearly Meeting, and will stay in dorm rooms at George Fox University.

How can I communicate with my family?

Twin Rocks has several phones on-site, and SLP team members are encouraged to come with pre-paid phone cards to communicate with their family at least once a week. Cell phones are allowed during these five-weeks but use will be restricted to designated times and places. Since the SLP team's schedule will be quite full, team members are encouraged to only call family members. E-mail and Internet access will be limited during the five weeks at Twin Rocks. Parents and Guardians may call the camp at any time, but should realize that SLP team members will not always be immediately available, but will be able to return messages as they are received. Parents and Guardians will have several opportunities to see what their student is involved in as part of the SLP team. As students arrive at the camp, parents are invited to stay to

participate in part of orientation that afternoon. Parents are also invited to join their student at Twin Rocks at the conclusion of SLP to meet the staff, participate in closing events, worship, and enjoy a meal together before traveling home in the afternoon.

Can I bring my car to use while Servant Leadership Program is occurring?

For safety and liability reasons, SLP team members are asked not to bring their vehicles to Twin Rocks Friends Camp. While at Twin Rocks, transportation will be provided by insured adult Twin Rocks staff in vehicles owned by the camp.

What rules will I be agreeing to if I accept a position on staff?

What are the fees?

SLP team members are expected to pay \$350 to cover four weeks of room and board at Twin Rocks, one week at Yearly Meeting in Newberg, and other program costs. SLP staff are also expected to arrange for travel to and from the camp at the beginning and conclusion of the program.
