Charting the Course Campaign

At the River Cruise for Camp event, Executive Director Ken Beebe presented the camp's next capital fundraising campaign. Over the next 4 years, Twin Rocks plans three key projects aimed at readying the camp for future generations of campers, projects that chart a course toward two of Twin Rocks' core purposes: Creating Christian Community and Developing Disciples of Jesus,

CO

YOUNG ADULT COMMUNITY HOUSE: A new home constructed for Twin Rocks' employees and interns provides an affordable place to live, a community of friends, and opportunities to deepen faith.

DINING CENTER EXPANSION: An expanded dining room and staff room reduces overcrowding and creates space for privacy for smaller groups with an additional portable wall. More space makes it easier for meaningful conversations and discipleship to happen naturally during mealtimes.

WATSECO CREEK VILLAGE PREPARATION:

Housing at the Oregon Coast has become increasingly ATING THE unaffordable for camp staff, necessitating a significant increase in onsite options. The camp is now ready to

conduct a project design and feasibility study for the development of 10 acres on the south end of Twin Rock's property, setting the stage for developing (in 5-10 years) a community of staff homes and relocating the camp's maintenance facilities outside the core of camp.

Blessings from Venezuela

Meet some of our newest team members from Venezuela — Jhonathan and José Diaz, two cousins in their late twenties, Rafael Reyes, his wife Jackeline, and their young adult daughter Rosibel. These five first arrived in the U.S. from Venezuela in early 2023 with visas and work permission that was granted to them due to the economic hardship in Venezuela. In 2016 Venezuela entered hyperinflation, with the annual inflation rate at some points rising over 1 million percent. "I was making twenty US dollars for working one month full-time," said Jhonathan Diaz. "Politics, schools, and the economy...It's ALL a mess." The unstable economy made it impossible to buy enough groceries or even think about being able to pay rent in Venezuela.

Upon arrival in the United States, they had support and a place to stay with their relatives, Angel and Marbelys Diaz, who are the pastors of McMinnville Friend's Church "Iglesia Amigos En McMinnville." They, along with 8 other family members who also came over from Venezuela, quickly got connected with Twin Rocks as volunteers while they waited for some final paperwork.

Last Spring camp staff weren't sure how they were going to be able to staff the camp adequately for the busy summer season. "It's amazing how God provided people right at a point when we really needed help," said Food Service Director Karl Seume, who has been dealing with staff shortages in the kitchen even outside of the

summer season. "They are all really hard workers and have been willing to jump in at any point and learn anything that's helpful to the camp." Twin Rocks was so grateful for their volunteer efforts this summer, and even more grateful that five from the group decided to pursue permanent employment at Twin Rocks.

Jhonathan and his cousin José work as kitchen interns with Karl Seume. Rafael works in maintenance and Jackeline and Rosibel in the kitchen and dishroom. "I really like the camp, I like practicing English, and the people are very friendly," said Rosibel, who studied architecture in Venezuela.

Rafael was a pastor in Venezuela for the last 27 years and says "The reason I was most motivated to work here is the camp's mission to support churches. I feel like I am in the right place doing the will of God by being at Twin Rocks." Rafael will also start to pastor a church plant in Tillamook soon. A group of Spanish speakers have been praying for a pastor for the last two years and recently connected with Rafael.

Harbor Villa Retreat Center: Twin Rocks' Beachfront Gathering Place

"How can you not get closer to God when He gives us such a beautiful place to enjoy?," reflects Steve Wilson, leader of Northwest Baptist Church's High School retreat, which has met each August at Harbor Villa since 2019. He goes on to say, "We wake up and have coffee time on the Anchorage porch, enjoying the morning sounds, smells, and sights of the beach view. After breakfast is morning worship and then the students form small groups and dig into God's Word. Enjoying God's Word on the beach is pretty awesome."

Like the NW Baptist youth, Harbor Villa Retreat Center, a ministry of Twin Rocks Friends Camp, has been home to annual getaways for youth groups, men's and women's church retreats, crafting groups, and family reunions since the 1970s when Twin Rocks Friends Camp Director Charlotte Macy purchased it as an old, rundown motel. Beautifully upgraded over the years, Harbor Villa is comprised of 5 oceanfront units—the larger Lighthouse,

Anchorage, and Harbor House plus the small Captain's Cabin and Lower Deck.

Family reunions and groups of up to 35 may rent the houses at Harbor Villa. Groups larger than 18 rent more than one of the larger houses. The River Church's women's retreat, led by Leslie Murphy, maximizes the opportunities for fellowship the self-contained homes allow. Leslie shares, "To help women get to know each other, kitchen crews, sleeping rooms and discussion groups are rotated, allowing women to interact with everyone over the course of the weekend."

The Schuldheisz Family has been coming to Harbor Villa each summer since about 1980. Mary Schuldheisz says highlights of their family reunion are sharing meals together, catching up with family, walking and playing on the beach, and sharing in family devotion and prayer times. Like the Schuldeisz family, each year about 55 families make their annual trek to Harbor Villa to share with extended family.

Besides typical church retreats and family reunions, specialty groups like the Rex Putnam High School's Kingsmen Thunder Drumline start their school year by bonding at Harbor Villa. Leader of the drumline, Rene Ormae-Jarmer says, "The setting of the ocean beach, the safe and cozy Harbor House, and the amazing hosts have allowed (me) and the staff to ease our 6th-12th graders into the year." Drumming and marching practice even takes

"We take (our week at Harbor Villa) to help our students learn how to share the Gospel. We help them to better understand what the Gospel is, how it should impact their lives and witness, and then we help them craft their testimonies. We want them to be constantly reminded of just how magnificent God is. If he can create such beauty and hold back the sea from the land He can certainly be trusted to care for us. What better place than the Oregon Coast and a beautiful beach front home to accomplish this purpose!"

From the Director's Desk

Dear Friends:

One of the rewards of working at a place like Twin Rocks Friends Camp is the opportunity to rub shoulders with incredibly caring people – folks who believe in the camp's Christian mission and willingly sacrifice on its behalf. "Rejoice always... Give thanks to God in all circumstances."

- I Thessalonians 5

Richard Nelson was one such person. Upon Richard's retirement from a career in the Army Corps of Engineers, Richard and his wife, Kathy, moved to Twin Rocks in 2019 to serve as live-in volunteers – Richard tinkering long hours in our maintenance department, Kathy faithfully folding sheets and towels in the camp's laundry room. Richard and Kathy regularly interacted with staff and campers half their age, ministering and mentoring in a quiet and gentle manner. They served at Twin Rocks from September 2019 to October 2022, when illness forced them to leave camp and move back to Portland.

A month ago, Richard passed away.

Richard was special. To me, what set him apart was his unending optimism and words of encouragement.

It seemed that every time Richard spoke, it was to share his gratitude for something or someone. He personified I Thessalonians 5: "Rejoice always... Give thanks in all circumstances." Richard regularly refocused us on God's goodness, and on all that the Lord was accomplishing at Twin Rocks. What an inspiration it was to have Richard walk alongside us through the pandemic and its aftermath, reminding us of God's unending faithfulness. We could invariably count upon Richard to compliment us, praise the work of the camp, encourage us, and otherwise make us feel good about ourselves. Richard also put us to shame: Some days we quietly bemoaned the difficulty of our work (for which we were paid), only to hear Richard declare how blessed he felt to spend retirement years at



Twin Rocks (volunteering). Over the years, Richard donated more than 9,000 hours of labor to Twin Rocks.

Even in times of tumult, Richard managed to see the Lord lovingly at work in his life. Shortly before his passing, Richard reflected over the events of the past year, and said, "God's goodness has been extraordinary."

The world needs more people like Richard Nelson.
